To the Editor
of the West Van News.

Dear Sir,
Would you please publish the
following:—

If you ask twenty-five parents
in West Vancouver why they
came to live here, fifteen will tell
you because of the beaches and
woods where the children can
play. Yet a few men, compris-
ing our School Board, without
the voters' consent, have herded
400 of our youth into a building
equipped for half the number.
Junior Matric classes are being
taught by overworked public
school teachers.

We no longer lay claim to hav-
ing a high school in West Van-
couver, only a Junior High.
Have the parent taxpayers no
say in this matter? Teachers
that have been with us for years
—loved by the children and re-
spected by the public, have been
discharged. Have our School
Board and remaining teachers
not heard of the words "co-oper-
ation and sharing of the work?"
Idle classrooms, idle teachers,
and the lowering of the general
standard of education while the
ogres, Interest and Sinking
Fund, rule our community.
