## Whitby Clubs Opens E.O.B.A. Schedule

In Eastern Ontario Baseball Assoc. action, Whitby won their share of games in contests dominated by strong pitching performances. The Canadian Tire Midgets took their season opener in Belleville 9 - 4 on the strength of a standout pitching chore by southpaw Steve Sarginson who yielded only two hits while striking out 12. The Tiremen jumped into an 8 - 0 lead in the first inning and this gave them the early margin they needed to pull out the victory. Sarginson helped his won cause with a pair of hits an output matched by Tim Brown. Other Whitby hitters were Alex and Brian Kehoe, Mike Rowley, Cam O'Donnell and Kevin Roche.

The Legionaires playing in the E.O.B.A. Pee-Wee series made their '74 debut a big one dumping Ajax 27 - 0 at Cedar Park in Ajax with Legionaire right-hander Larry Chizen throwing a no hitter and coming within one runner of a pitcher's "dream", a perfect game. Only one Ajax runner reached first base and this was on an error by the Whitby club. Chizen notched 15 strikeouts. The Legionaires picked up 17 hits with Murray McCorkell leading the way with three singles, while John Wall, Rick Dunphy and Greg Puchalski each added a pair of safeties. Singles were contributed by Dave Ciehanski, Mike Welling, Grant Leitch, Dennis Fulton, Greg Rich, Justin Parry, Kevin MacLellan and Larry Chizen. In their next two outings in a busy week for club they tasted defeat, first at the hands of Oshawa who dumped them 12 - 3 at Peel and then in Peterborough where they lost a 1 - 0 decision. In the game against Oshawa the Legionaires were able to pick up only two hits off their old teammate John Samanski, with Murray McCorkell and Larry Chizen getting a double and a single. In the liftlock city the Legionaires lost a 1 - 0 heartbreaker with a lone tally by Peterborough in the fourth inning holding up for the win. Larry Chizen was tagged with the loss but came through with a pitching performance which is good enough for a win most times, giving up five hits and striking out 9.

The McDonald Big Macs started the week with an exhibition tilt against Scarborough Birchmount and came through with a 12 - 0 victory. Cam Murkar started for the Big Macs throwing hitless baseball for five innings and Dave McWhirter and Mark MacDonald finished the final four without yielding a safety to complete the no hitter. They won their E.O.B.A. opener by default when they journeyed to Lindsay only to have no one show up at the ball park. In their home opener against Courtice on Sunday the game turned out to be an unfortunate mismatch of the kind which doesn't help either team. When it was over the Whitby club were winners 39 - 0 in the abbreviated contest in which the Big Macs were out in front 22 - 0 after two innings. Dave McWhirter picked up the win with a no hit performance in which Mark Mac-Donald finished on the mound with three hitless innings also.
