- 1. The Military Convalescent
 Hosptial (now Whitby Mental
 Health Centre) sold photo post
 cards of its building for the
 soldiers from 1917 to 1919.
- The old St. John's Roman Catholic Church rectory was designed in 1914 by Albert Asa Post, a noted church architect from Whitby who then lived in Buffalo, N.Y.
- 3. Samuel Trees and Company owned the Whitby blanket factory from 1909 to 1958 and the buckle factory from 1929 to 1964.
- 4. A building from the old buckle factory at Brock and Gilbert streets was moved to Whitby harbour to be the first club house for the Whitby Yacht Club in 1966.
