You might know that the Harrow Greenhouse and Processing Crops Research Centre is one of the longest weather recording centres in Canada, but did you know Japan considers it number one for testing soybeans?

Soybean research conducted at the Harrow centre was highlighted during the Harrow Field Day held Aug 21, with tours of research laboratories at the facility and field research plots.

"We are the number one analysis lab found in North and South America," said Doug Jessop, an agricultural research technician, who outlined the operations of the soybean research laboratories in Harrow, including a facility to make test samples of tofu, an increasingly popular soy-based food.

Jessop said soybean test results are much sought after by Japanese tofu producers, who are looking for the specific qualities in their product.

"Japan says we're number one," he said.

Dr. Vaino Poysa, a soybean-plant breeding scientist, highlighted the centre's soybean development program.

"Our aim is to increase the properties that satisfy all the requirements of producers," he said, speaking of the centre's research capability for improving soybean crops, providing the

"The Risk Management Program provides another tool for Ontario grain and oilseed farmers to help meet the challenges of a volatile international commodity market," said Geri Kamenz, president of the Ontario Federation of Agriculture. "We will be calling on the federal government to recognize this important program and to contribute to its success. This brings Ontario producers closer to the same type of companion programs that have stabilized farm incomes for our colleagues in Quebec."

Grain and oilseed production in Ontario is valued at about \$1.7 billion, and is a key input into the livestock industry, the food processing industry and ethanol production.

protein, oil and sugar content desirable to Asian markets.

Dr. Lorna Woodrow explained how soybean protein, oil, and fibre content are measured by nearinfrared reflectance, using a NIR system at the Harrow

centre. Researchers are looking to improve the quality of soybean breeds grown in Canada, making them desirable for Asia's soybased foods such as soymilk, tofu, miso and soy sauce.

currently accounts for just two per cent of soybean exports, selling 800,000 metric tonnes.

New product applications and other markets are also increasing the demand for the kind of high quality food-based soybeans Canada produces.

Currently, about 73 per cent of Canadian soybeans originate in Ontario, where over two million metric tonnes are harvested each year.

Dr. Poysa said there are more than 20 scientists working at the research centre, with as many laboratories supporting their research.

The Harrow facility is part of a national network of 19 Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada research cen-

tres. The centre develops and transfers new technologies for the production of greenhouse vegetables, including tomatoes, cucumbers and peppers, and fieldgrown processing vegetables, soybeans, and edible beans.

About 120 people attended the field day tour, including producers and local citizens interested in seeing the work done at the centre.
