Child is Crushed to Death by Truck Driven by Father

Little Catherine Doetsch, 4, daugh-ter of Mr. and Mrs. John R. Doetsch, 2149 Glenview road, Wilmette, died Thursday, September 11, after she was crushed beneath the wheels of a truck driven by her father. The accident occurred in Evanston

avenue, just south of the Evanston-Wilmette line. It was Evanston's first traffic fatality since October 19, 1946.

Mr. Doetsch had put Catherine on a box in their back yard and warned her to stay there while he went to give a friend's milk truck a push with his vehicle.

But little Catherine wanted a ride and so, as her daddy drove away, she pursued his truck. As she overtook the truck she slipped and fell beneath the right rear wheel.

Mr. Doetsch felt the bump and stopped the truck. He took the child to the Evanston hospital where she was pronounced dead.

The Doetsch's have two other children, John Jr., 5, and Susan, $2\frac{1}{2}$. Catherine was buried last Monday at St. Joseph's cemetery.
