## Barat 'Dancers-in-Residence' Include Three From Shore

Three North Shore dancers are members of a company recently appointed artists in residence at Barat College, Lake Forest.

They are Miss Margo Grimmer, 970 Vernon Av., Glencoe; Nana (Mrs. Will H.) Shineflug, 800 Elm St., Glenview; and Miss Sherry Dicus of Deerfield, who teaches ballet for the Glencoe Park-Recreation District.

The three are members of the Phyllis Sabold Dance Company, a three-year old group that has performed at Barat College and in the greater Chicago area. The company was incorporated as a nonprofit organization in 1965, and since then, both a women's board and a men's board have been formed.

The boards sponsored a Calling Card performance at Barat College last spring to introduce the company to potential supporters. The company also gives lecture-demonstrations for the Inner City Program of the Chicago Board of Education, for the Pushup Program of the Chicago Committee for Urban Opportunity, and for suburban area schools.

Choreographer Phyllis Sabold of Highland Park chooses her themes from music, art, and literature, varying in time from Chaucer's "Canterbury Tales" to Anne Morrow Lindbergh's "Gift From the Sea." "Sea, Shell, and Self," based

on the Lindbergh book, twice has been performed on CBS-TV Repertory Theater.

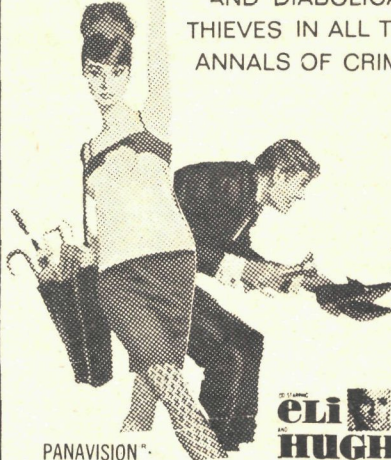

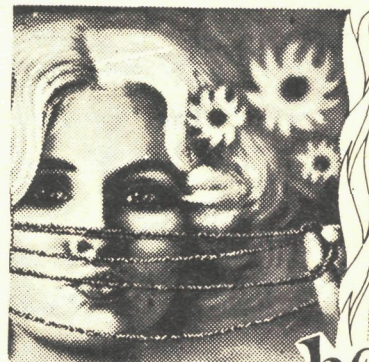

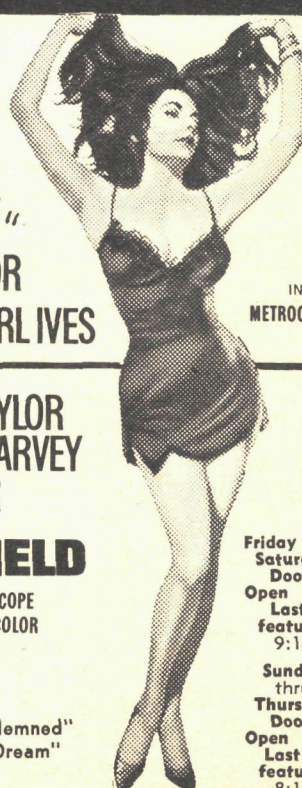
