

## Historian to Discuss Vietnam For Area World Federalists

An historian's view of southeast Asian politics and the Vietnam war will be presented at a public meeting Tuesday of the North Shore chapter of the United World Federalists.

Dr. John Roy McLane, assistant professor of history at Northwestern University, will talk on his research and experiences while in India and other southeast Asian countries from 1964 until a few months ago.

The meeting is scheduled for 8 p.m. in the Winnetka home of Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Sieck, 843 Bryant Av.

Dr. McLane earlier spent three months in India as an undergraduate under the auspices of the Experiment in International Living. During his more recent stay he was named senior research fellow in Calcutta by the American Institute of Indian Studies. He has done extensive research in Asian and Indian history and culture.

The North Shore chapter, which has about 300 members, is devoted

to the cause of "World Peace Through World Law." Chapter president is Robert Bartlett of Glencoe.
