

DOROTHY DAVIS STARS IN ANNUAL TRACK MEET

Little Vattman Park Girl Is High Point Winner in Recent Playground Events

A well balanced track team from Vattman park ran rough shod over teams from Laurel, Village Green and the Wilmette beach, to score 100 points in the village wide track meet sponsored by the Wilmette Playground and Recreation board.

Winning 10 first, 12 seconds and 14 thirds for a grand total of 100 points, the versatile Vattman park team scored nearly twice as many points as its closest competitor, Laurel which scored 50 points.

The Wilmette beach followed Laurel with 39 points and the Village Green brought up the rear with 26 points.

Vattman had a large squad of 21 point winners, nearly three times as many as either of the other playgrounds and twice as many on their squad as the runners up, Laurel. All of Laurel's points were won by five boys and two girls.

For Vattman, Dorothy Davis was the individual high scorer with 15 points. Jane Brandt was second with 11 and Howard Bull third with 10. Laurel's high point scorer was Elsa vonReinsperg who scored 13 points. Colin Finlayson scored 10 points and the other five ranged from 6 up to 10. Mary Schutter and Bernice Penrod led the Beach team with 8 points a piece, and Kenneth Wolf led the Village Green with 6 points.

Incidentally, Dorothy Davis tallied the most individual points in the meet. Her total of 15 was responsible for three firsts. She won the thirty yard dash with a fast time of 5.9, only one tenth of a second slower than the boys' time. In the standing broad jump, Dorothy leaped 5 feet 5 inches which is farther than the boys' distance. Her last victory was in the hopping race. She negotiated the thirty yards in 8.4, two tenths of a second faster than the boys' time. Dorothy is the daughter of Daniel M. Davis, director of the Wilmette Playground and Recreation board.

Colin Finlayson, age 12, was clocked in the forty-yard dash at 5.9. This is believed to be a record for that age.
