

SUGGEST THIS MAIL SCHEDULE

Shoppers Given Chance to Aid Post Office

So that north shore people will mail their packages for Christmas delivery in plenty of time, postal officials have issued a schedule for states in the different sections of the country. The last of the foreign mail went last week, and parcels for delivery in the United States began this week.

To insure delivery by Wednesday, December 24, it is recommended that the following schedule be observed. There are no deliveries on any rural route on Christmas day, it was explained, and no deliveries in any city on Christmas day except that which can be delivered before 11 o'clock. All carriers must be off the streets by 11 o'clock.

For Pacific Coast
Parcels going to the Pacific coast states, including Washington, Oregon, California, Nevada, and Idaho, should be mailed on December 12 and 13.

The schedule is as follows for the other states:
Western states, Montana, Wyoming, Utah, December 14 to 16. Southwestern states: Arizona, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas, December 14 to 16. Near-western states: North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska, Kansas, Colorado, December 15 to 16. Southern states: Arkansas, Louisiana, Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, Florida, Virginia, West Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, December 15 to 16.

For Nearby States
Neighboring states: Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, Wisconsin, Illinois, Michigan, Indiana, Ohio, Kentucky, December 17 to 19. Eastern states: New York, Pennsylvania, Maryland, New Jersey, Delaware, and New England states: December 15 to 18. Local states: Iowa for Iowa offices; Illinois for Illinois offices, December 18 to 20.

Place Your Return Address in Upper Left Hand Corner

As a means of cooperating with postal employees, the postmaster has asked residents to place their return card on letters and packages in the upper left hand corner, instead of on the back, as many have heretofore.

Letters, particularly, he pointed out, bear the return address on the flap in the back, especially those which have been printed. In the event that the letters are not delivered to the person to whom they are addressed, the postal employees must handle the letter unnecessarily to learn where it is to be returned to, he explained.

Whereas, if the return address is in the upper left hand corner, the letter is merely stamped for return, simplifying matters considerably.

North Shore Concert to Stress Holiday Spirit

The third of the season's North Shore community concerts given Tuesday, December 16, on the great organ of St. Luke's church, Evanston, will be a Christmas festival program.

The organ numbers are all on Christmas themes and will be played by Herbert E. Hyde, dean of the Illinois chapter of The American Guild of Organists. He will be assisted by St. Luke's vested choir of 40 voices which will sing six or eight selections, including familiar melodies and a group of three glorious old Bohemian carols in the mediaeval polyphonic music.

Modern music is built on harmonious chords; polyphonic music is the interweaving of four to eight separate threads of melody—the kind of music sung by the famous Sistine Choir of Rome. Polyphonic music has been called by some historians, the musical analogue of Greek art and of Gothic architecture.

Christmas Savings Club Members Get Their Checks

Checks amounting to nearly \$50,000 were sent out to Christmas Savings club members by Wilmette banks recently. Depositors of the First National bank had \$14,800 in the savings club and about \$35,000 was distributed by the Wilmette State bank. 
