Add New Shoppers' Train to North Shore Schedule

Additional transportation service for suburban shoppers and others wishing to return home before the rush hour in the afternoon is now being furnished by the North Shore line, beginning Monday, November 2, according to announcement by the company. On that date a new express train, operating between Adams and Wabash station in the loop and Highland Park, was placed into service daily except Sundays.

The new train leaves Adams and Wabash station at 4:30 p. m., Randolph and Wabash at 4:31 p. m., Grand avenue at 4:35 p. m., Wilson avenue at 4:51 p. m. and Howard street at 4:58 p. m. In addition to giving suburban shoppers additional service, it greatly facilitates handling of rush hour crowds.

With installation of this additional train, the North Shore line has an express train leaving the Loop every 15 minutes during the busiest hour of the afternoon.

Expect Huge Crowd for Purple-Michigan Game

Soldiers' Field, Chicago's great municipal stadium, will be the scene of the Michigan-Northwestern game to be played Saturday, before an audience which gives every indication of filling every available seat in the big inclosure.

Two thousand five hundred reserved seat tickets went on sale Monday morning. Three thousand seats will be placed on sale the day of the game. These latter ducats will be for the seats in the colonnade and at the end of the field. The advance order sale of the tickets has been large and when the teams go into play it is expected that more than 30,000 spectators will be seated in the classic structure.
