

Baptist Church

The week commencing November 8, will be observed as Father and Son week in the Baptist church. Mr. Stiffer will deliver his annual address to fathers and sons at the morning service at 11 o'clock. All fathers and sons are invited to attend this service and all men without sons are urged to bring some boy who might not otherwise attend church.

In recognition of Armistice Sunday, the Girl Scout members of the church will act as ushers as they will do in many churches. There will be baptism at the morning service.

The Sunday school will meet at the regular hour, with graded instruction for all ages. There is a men's class, and a women's class and classes for young men and young women.

The speaker at the 5:30 meeting of the Charter B. Y. P. U. in Children's hall will be Edwin Phelps, general secretary of the B. Y. P. U. of America. Mr. Phelps is one of the five founders of the Wilmette Baptist church and organizer of the Young People's work of the church and has now for the past two years been serving as Executive head of Baptist Young People's work all over the territory of the Northern Baptist Convention. He is affectionately known by the older members of the local society as "Pa."

and doctrine. The worship period concludes the program, from 8:50 to 9:20.

The Choral society will meet for rehearsal with Madame Gilderoy Scott at 8 o'clock Thursday evening.

Friday is the date for the Fathers' and Sons' banquet. It is set for 6:30 at the church. A committee under the direction of M. E. Reid is preparing the last detail of menu, decoration, favors and program, and is anticipating the greatest Father and Son gathering in the history of the church. 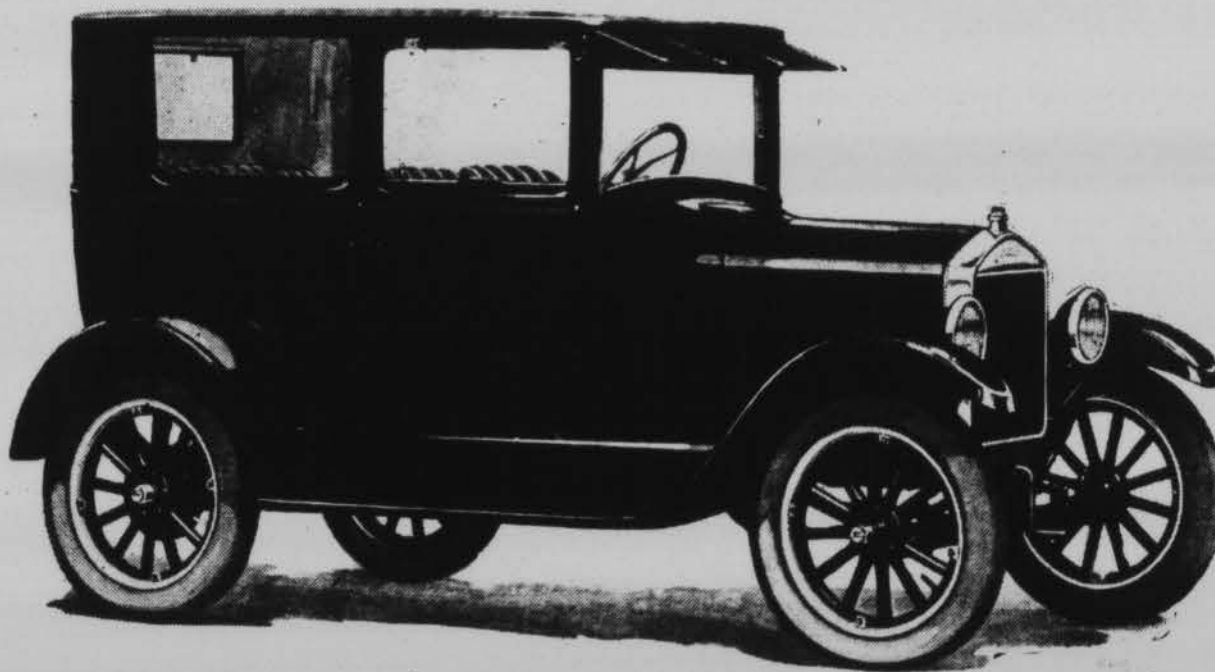
