

## 'SAMSON AND DELILAH' NEXT SUNDAY'S OPERA

**"Suburban Special" Will Find  
Homer and Marshall Singing  
the Leading Roles**

Sunday, November 15 brings a decided novelty in the bill of the Chicago Civic Opera company for the "Suburban Special," as the matinee performance is known, because of the big out-of-town patronage drawn every Sunday afternoon. "Samson and Delilah" will be sung, a spectacular opening for the third week. A star cast, including Louise Homer, Charles Marshall, Edouard Cotreuil, Cesare Formichi, Jose Mojica, Ladovico Oliviero, Antonio Nicolich and Desire Deffere will interpret the colorful Biblical opera.

Monday, November 16 brings a repetition of "Manon Lescaut," with Muzio, Cortis, Rimini and Cotreuil in the cast. Moranzoni will conduct. Tuesday, Gounod's masterpiece, "Faust" will be given with Miss Sawyer in the role of Marguerite. Others in the cast include Hackett, Bonelli and Lazzari. Grovlez conducting.

Wednesday, "The Masked Ball" will be repeated with Raisa, Marshall, Lenska and Steel; Polacco conducting. "Die Walkure" will be given its premiere performance of the season on Thursday evening with Ferrai, Van Gordon, Lenska, Lamont, Kionis and Cotreuil in the cast; Polacco conducting. Friday night no performance is scheduled. Saturday afternoon, November 21, "Martha" will be sung with Mason, Pavloska, Schipa, Lazzari and Trevisan; Moranzoni conducting. Saturday night "Il Trovatore" will be sung at popular prices with Muzio, Lenska, Cortis and Bonelli; Weber conducting.

Charles Moor, the German opera expert brought from Darmstadt to stage "Der Rosenkavalier" for the Chicago Civic Opera company and who has attracted wide attention not only through the success of that production but also because of the fact that in spite of his unique German status he

is a Scotchman, has deferred his return to Germany to accept a second commission from the Chicago company. He will stage a revival of "Die Walkure" Friday, November 19, leaving immediately thereafter to resume his duties as stage director at the Landes theatre, Darmstadt.

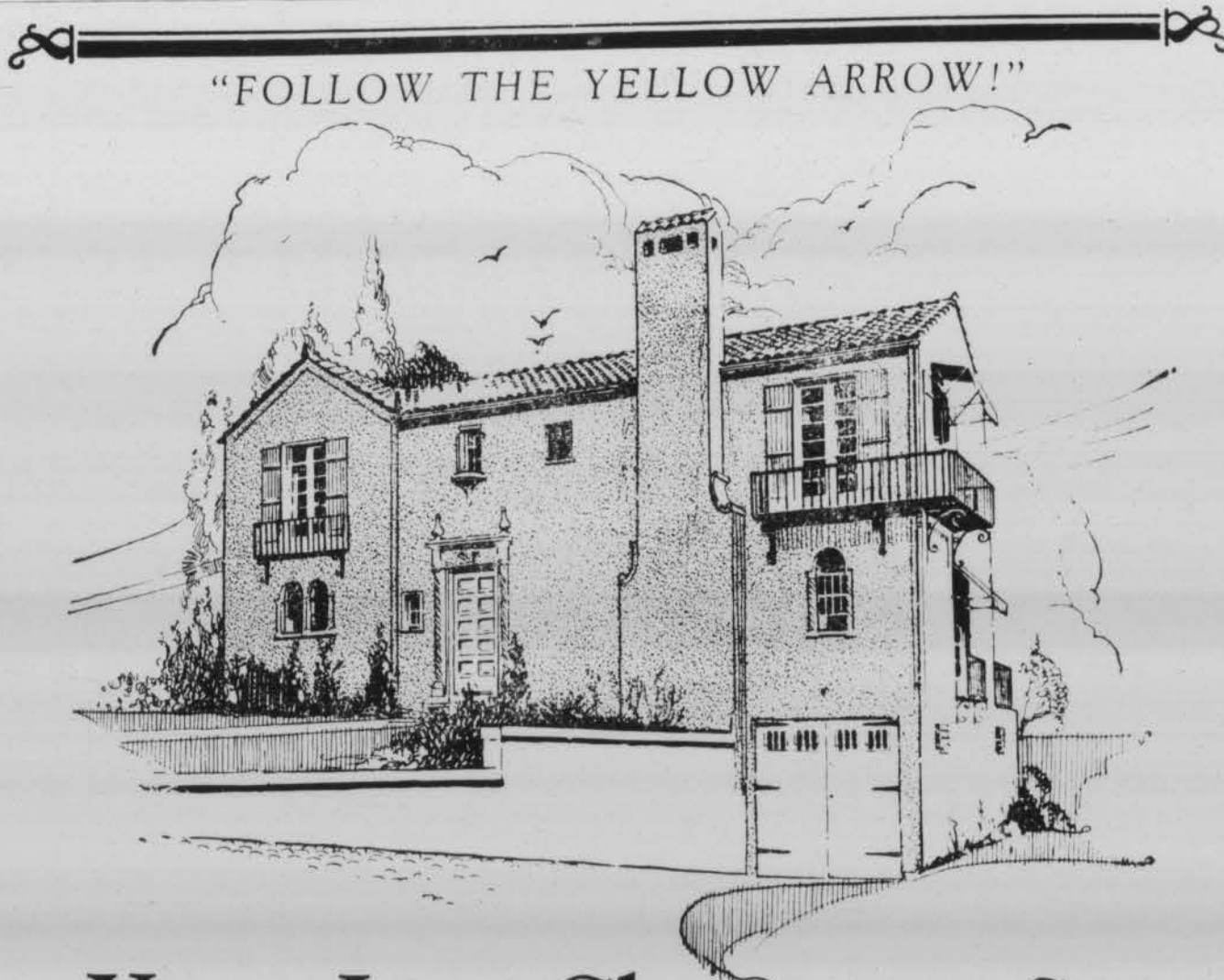
