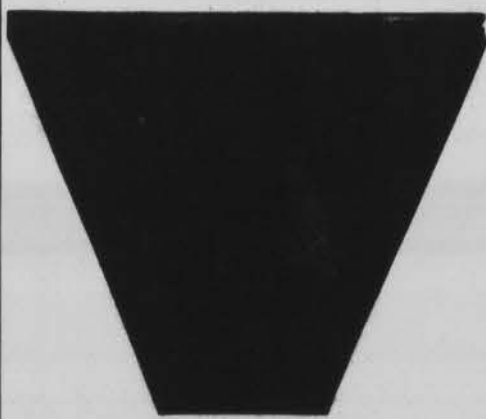

### "The Blue Boy"—A Living Picture

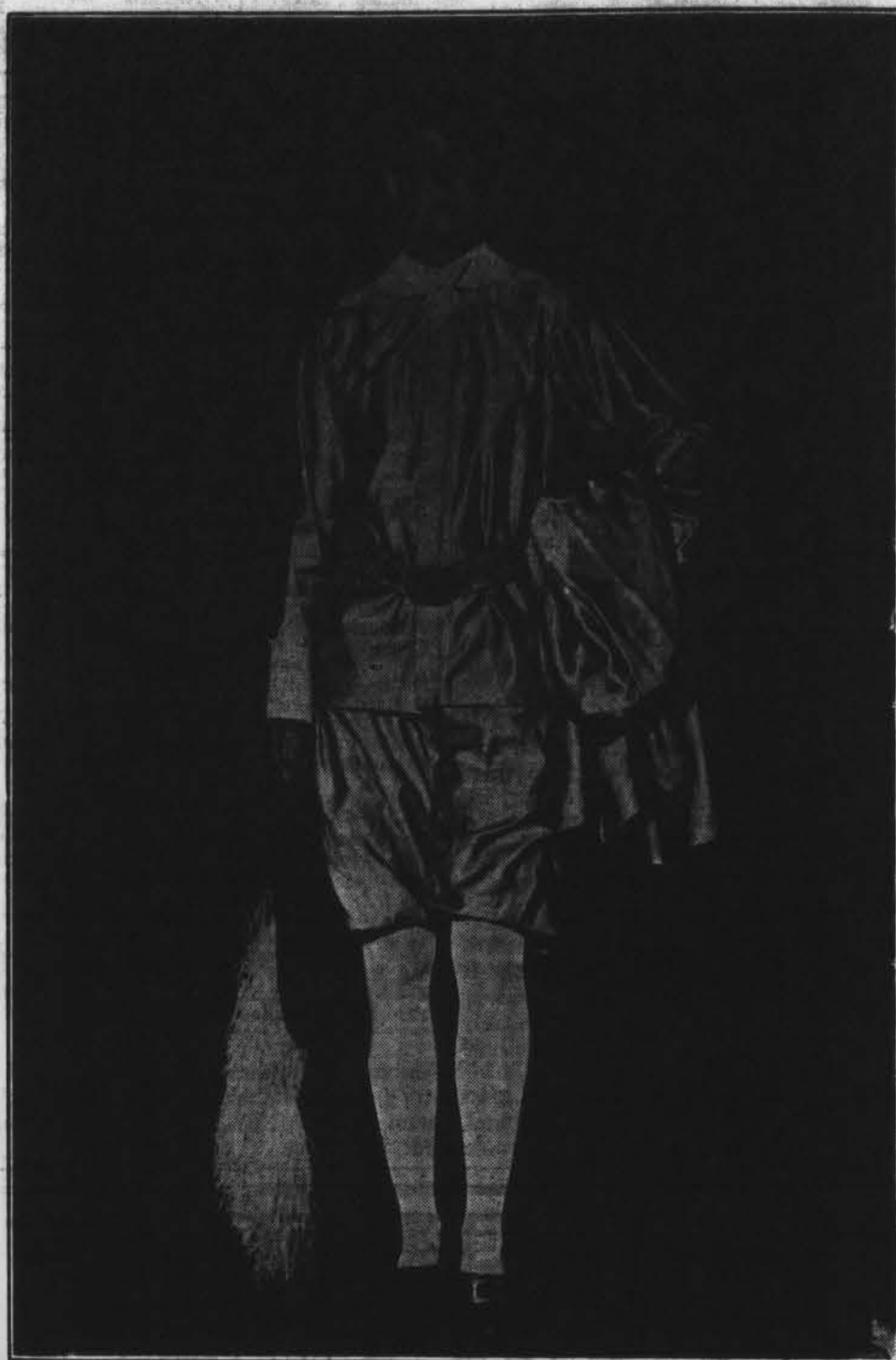
