

Annual World Mart to Be Conducted April 17

The annual "world mart" held at the National Kindergarten and Elementary college, for which members of its International club gather together alluring wares from the foreign lands in which they make their homes, will be offered at Harrison hall between 4 and 7, Wednesday, April 17.

There will be a Hansel and Gretel food shop, a Japanese tea garden, and other attractive vending places in foreign setting presided over by students in native costume. Proceeds will benefit the fund whereby the International club, which has a membership of ten foreign girls and an equal number of American "sisters," hopes to raise a sum sufficient to support a foreign student in the college dormitory next year. Miss Anita Jauckens is president of the club and Miss Mildred Melone of Wilmette is general chairman of the mart.

GUIDE-LECTURE TOURS

"Mexico" and "The Primates" at 11 and 3 o'clock, respectively, on Monday April 15, will open next week's program of free guide-lecture tours at Field Museum of Natural History. On other days at the same hours subjects will be: Tuesday, "Farmer Indians" and "Life in the Arctic;" Wednesday, "Mummies" and "Invertebrates;" Thursday, two synoptic tours of the Departments of anthropology, botany, geology and zoology; and Friday, "Coal and Petroleum" and "Cooking Utensils of Primitive Peoples." Parties for these tours of the exhibits under the guidance of staff lecturers assemble inside the north entrance of the museum.

LECTURES AT MUSEUM

Prof. Forest Ray Moulton, noted astronomer, formerly of the faculty of the University of Chicago, will give a

free illustrated lecture for the public at Field Museum of Natural History, Saturday, April 13. "Recent Explorations in Time and in Space" is the title of Professor Moulton's lecture, which will begin at 3 p. m., and will be given in the James Simpson Theatre of the museum. Professor Moulton will use stereopticon slides made from photographs taken from the world's greatest astronomical observatories. Among things to be shown are a cluster of

100,000 suns, the huge craters of the moon, and eruptions extending for a distance as great as that from the earth to the moon.
