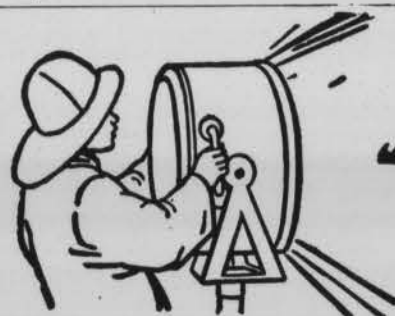
been prepared and is ample to take care of the thousands of people who it is expected will visit the airport on the opening days.

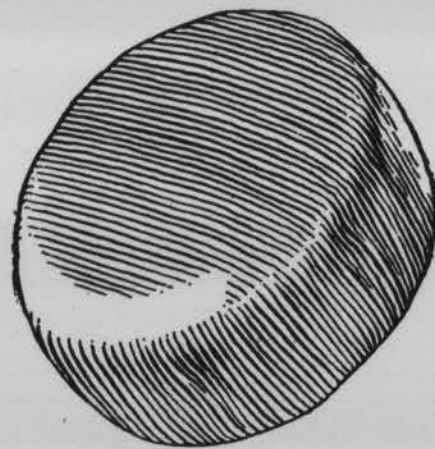
