

O'Leary Contest to Mark Third Week on Village Playgrounds

The village-wide O'Leary contest will mark the third week of the summer playground season which opens Monday. The contest will be for senior girls only and will be held at 2 o'clock Thursday afternoon at Vattman Park. Mrs. Alta B. Caldwell, playground instructor at Vattman will conduct the tournament.

Each playground will send three entrants to the meet and ribbons will be awarded to winners of the first, second, and third places.

Poster contests will be held at each playground during the week in addition to the village wide o'leary tournament, and winners at each playground will be eligible to submit their posters in the village wide poster making contest which will be held on the following week.

Kick Ball for Girls

Kick ball for girls will also be inaugurated during the week and a complete schedule has been outlined by Daniel M. Davis, director of recreation, which will determine the village-wide champions in kick ball. Preliminary instruction in track meets preparatory to the village-wide track meet to be held later in the season is being given at each of the playgrounds and eliminations for determining representative contestants for each playground will be held within the next two weeks.

The main attraction of this week's program was the beginning of a membership drive which started at 9 o'clock Monday morning and will end July 6. Each playground has an average attendance of 175 children daily and Director Davis hopes to increase the average to 200 through the membership drive and to increase the present enrollment by more than 1,000 children.

The first playground ball contest for boys and the first beach day program were events of this week. The first playground ball game was played Tuesday afternoon at the Village Green between the Vattman playground and the Village Green playground. Vattman was the victor by a score of 13 to 3.

200 Enrolled in Swim Classes

More than 200 children under 14 years of age are enrolled in the daily swimming classes conducted by the playground instructors at the beach. This number is expected to be doubled as soon as the water is warmer. Classes are conducted from 2 to 4 o'clock, and an additional hour from 4 to 5 o'clock is devoted to working for points under the direction of the instructors.

A great deal of interest has already been displayed in scoring points toward the gold medals awarded to the three people reaching the 500 point mark first. Three boys, Frank McCabe, John Culler, and Bob Hewitt are tied for first place at the present time with Grete von Reinsperg and Jean Burns coming second.

More than 250 children are expected to compete in the first beach day program which is being held this afternoon. Points may be scored in the following events:

20-yard dashes—boys and girls ten years old and under; 25-yard dashes—boys and girls eleven, twelve, thirteen years old; 50-yard dashes—boys and girls sixteen years old and over; hurdle race—boys fourteen years and under; one-armed race—girls fifteen years and under; under-water race—girls ten years and under; dead man's float for distance—boys fourteen and under.

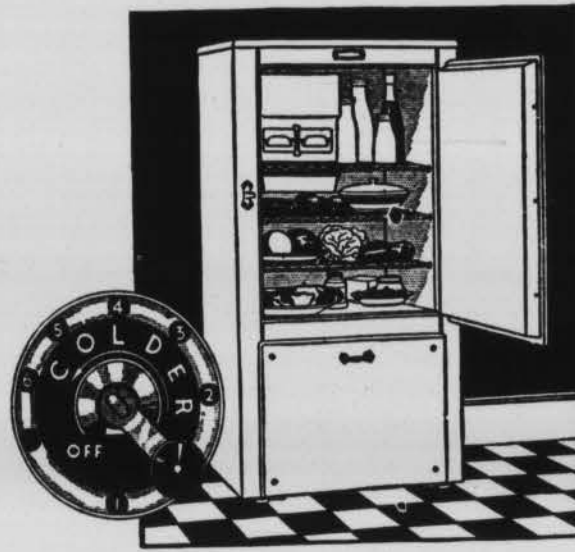
