poser at the time this work was first
produced. Mr. Johnson has demon-
strated his genius in interpreting the
role of Julien while the part of the

that of the mother, sung by Mme.
Claussen, are classics of histrionic
singing. Others in this cast are Jose
Mojica, Mr. D'Angelo, Miss Maxwell,
Miss Swarthout, Miss Falco and Miss
