Sample Sentences Give Insight Into New Books

Among the new books to be found at the Wilmette Public library are "The Soul of Spain," by Havelock Ellis, and "The Psychology of Happiness," by Walter B. Pitkin. Miss Anne L. Whitmack has selected two sample sentences which will give readers an idea of the content of the two books. Here they are:

In the Spanish men of today, however, it is sometimes difficult to recognize the splendid and restless activities of their forefathers . . . War alone, if sufficiently prolonged and severe, suffices to deplete a nation of its most vigorous stocks. "The warlike nation of today," says President Jordan, "is the decadent nation of tomorrow." The martial ardour and success of the Spaniards lasted for more than a thousand years; it was only at very great cost that the Romans subdued the Iberians, and down to the sixteenth century the Spaniards were great soldiers; but the struggle in the Netherlands wasted their energies, and when at Recroy, in the middle of the seventeenth century, the Spanish infantry that had been counted the finest in Europe went down before the French, the military splendour of Spain had vanished.

Were we to undertake a complete analysis of the happiness and unhappiness of a given personality, our main tasks would be four. We should first have to discover every important trend in the man's nature, distinguishing as far as possible those which are native from those which are acquired. Next we should have to observe the dynamic relations among those trends, especially their relative strengths . . . This done, we should have to look at the physical and mental equipment of the man in order to ascertain its fitness in realizing the entire system of wishes. Finally we should scrutinize his available energies, measuring them against the entire system of wishes.
