Helen Hyde Carter has been chosen by the Playground and Recreation board to conduct a six weeks' course in Contract and Auction Bridge, beginning the second week in February. In addition to being a former resident of Wilmette, Mrs. Carter is widely known as a bridge expert. She is a contributor to various bridge magazines and is a student of Wilbur C. Whitehead and other experts. Six weeks of each year she spends in the East attending conventions of bridge experts gathered there from all over the country. On one such occasion she studied the Vanderbill convention of bidding and part of her lectures will date for the evening classes and be devoted to this particular phase of the place where the class will meet bridge. Other conventions of bidding, the two demand bids, forcing bids, etc., will also be taken up during the course. Pattern hands and deals will be given to illustrate points covered.

Mr. Seymour will use for his lecture the same system taught by Mrs. Carter.

The well-known, "According to Hoyle," referring to the Hoyle "Book of Games" which has become passe during the past few years, has been revised by Mr. Seymour as his latest contribution to the science of bridge. He is also the author of "Auction Bridge for Beginners," "Highlights on Auction," "Auction Bridge Simplified," and "Simplified Bridge Auction and Contract," and at the present time is serving as president of the National Auction Bridge Institute.

Mrs. Carter's lectures and lessons will be held on Friday afternoons for beginners in auction bridge and on either Monday or Thursday evenings for contract bridge players. A fee will be charged for the sixlesson course and tickets for the lecture are placed on sale for each. No registrations will be accepted for single lessons and enrollment fees are payable in advance.
