

NEW TRIER YEARBOOK GOES TO PRESS SOON

High School Annual, "The Echoes," to Be Ready for Distribution June 2

New Trier High school's annual, "The Echoes," will be ready for distribution at the school on Monday, June 2, according to present plans, Robert Carpenter, faculty sponsor of the yearbook, stated this week.

Most of the pictures that are to appear in the book have already been taken and about two-thirds of the engravings have been made. Practically everything that is to go into the annual has been turned over to the editors, with the exception of some written material. The staff planned to have all pictures to the engravers by Friday of this week, and May 9 has been set as the deadline for all material for the book to be in the hands of the printer.

"The Echoes" this year will contain at least 208 pages, and its makeup will be similar to that of last year's book. A reproduction of the top of the tower on the central building at the New Trier campus will appear on the cover.

There will be sections devoted to campus views, administration and faculty, classes, athletics, activities and organizations, and advertisements. In the class section will be individual pictures of all seniors, together with accounts of their high school activities. Dramatics, music, oratory, debate, publications, student council, Tri-Ship club, Girls' club, honor societies, and some thirty other clubs will be represented in the activities and organizations section.

"The annual is an attempt to give as complete and accurate a picture as possible of events at New Trier throughout the school year," says Robert Carpenter, who, for the fifth year, is the faculty member in charge of the production of the book.

The cost of publishing the annual is covered by student subscriptions, advertisements, and charges made to the various clubs and organizations whose pictures appear in the book. Only once has the New Trier board of education been called upon for a loan.

Mrs. Ralph Gromann, 213 Sixth street, entertained a group of her friends at her home on Thursday of last week at a luncheon and bridge party.


