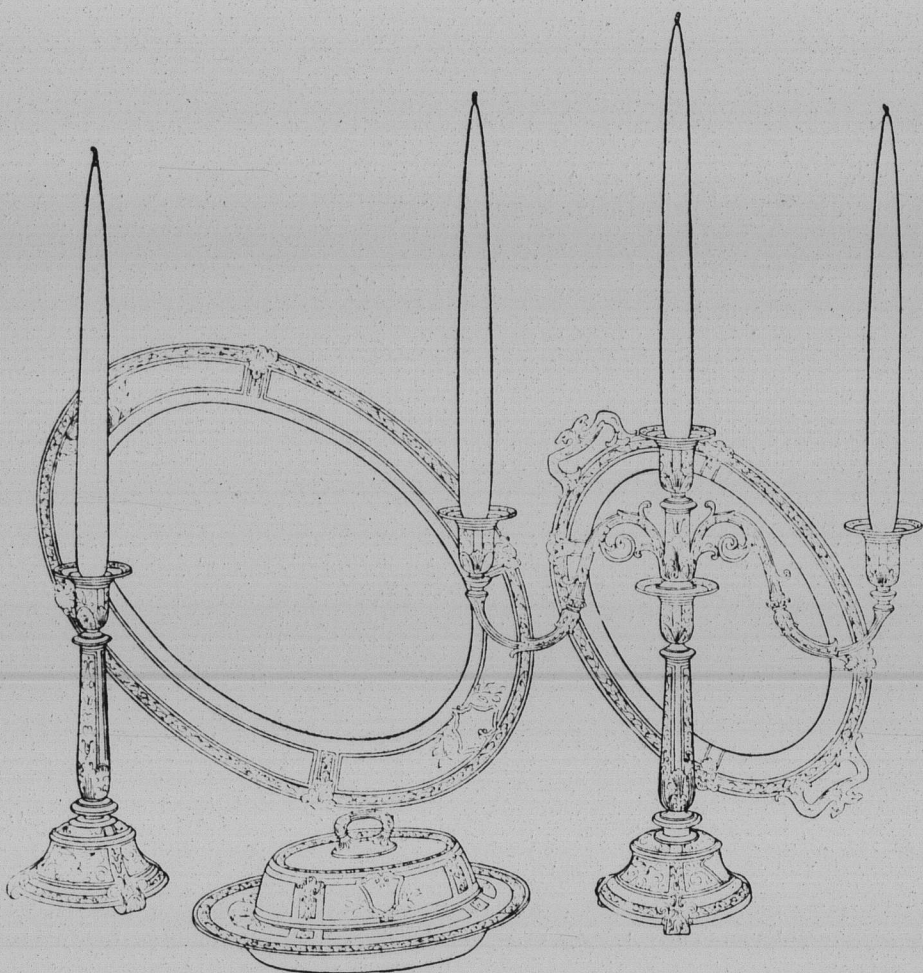

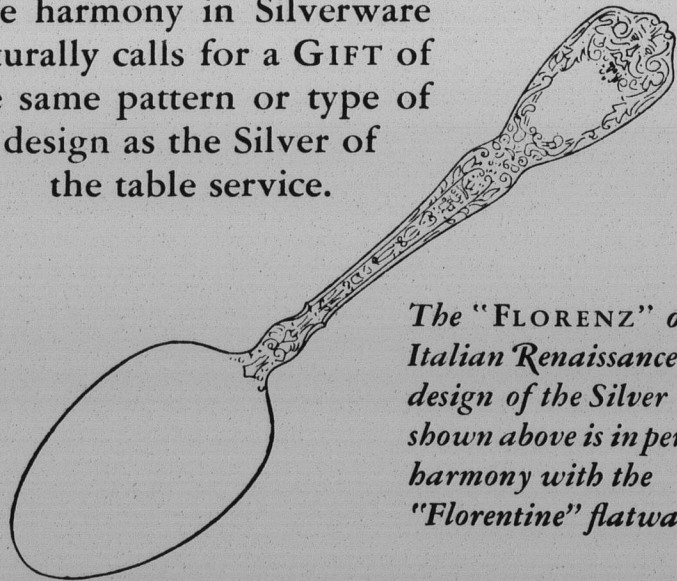

The United States government will open a training camp for young men—17 to 24—at Fort Sheridan on July 31. The War Department conducts this camp for one month with all necessary expenses paid. There is no military obligation.

The daily program includes military drill and instruction in the morning, a great variety of outdoor sports in the afternoon and many kinds of entertainment in the evening.

There is still room for young men from Cook county, but applications should be filed immediately by all who desire to attend. Applicants are asked to write for necessary blanks to The Military Training Camps association, 6 N. Michigan avenue, Chicago.
