



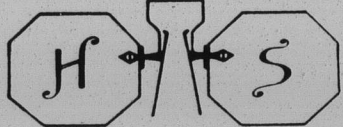

Annual Exhibit of Outdoor Life Next Week at Coliseum

Complete in every detail from the towering pine of the North Woods to such rarities of nature as humming birds' nests from the eastern shores of Lake Michigan, Chicago's Coliseum will be transformed into a vacation wonderland for the eight annual Outdoor Life exposition and Motor Boat show May 5 to 10, inclusive.

Nine carloads of pine, birch and balsam will be transplanted from their native soil in Wisconsin, Minnesota, and Michigan to specially prepared soil in the Coliseum to furnish a background for miniature lakes, wild life of the north, an Ojibwa Indian village, a complete logging camp built to scale and exhibits of the newest in hunting and fishing equipment, camp outfits and outdoor costumes.

Wild life of the North Woods and Canada, wild turkeys from the Wisconsin state game farm, porcupines from Itaska county, Minnesota, bear cubs, baby coyotes from Michigan, deer, young badgers, raccoons, mink and beaver will roam the Coliseum during the exposition. Bass, trout, pike, pickerel and other fish from northern streams will swim in the artificial pools and brooks of the Coliseum.

Scenes of Black Hills

South Dakota's Black Hills will have exhibits depicting the wonders of the hills country, site of Mount Rushmore national memorial, where Calvin Coolidge's 500-word history of the United States will be carved, scene of the gold rush of '76, Deadwood days and other vacation attractions. Canada, with her Land of the Nipigon and Rainy Lake districts, will portray the wild setting of her woods and lakes in miniature.

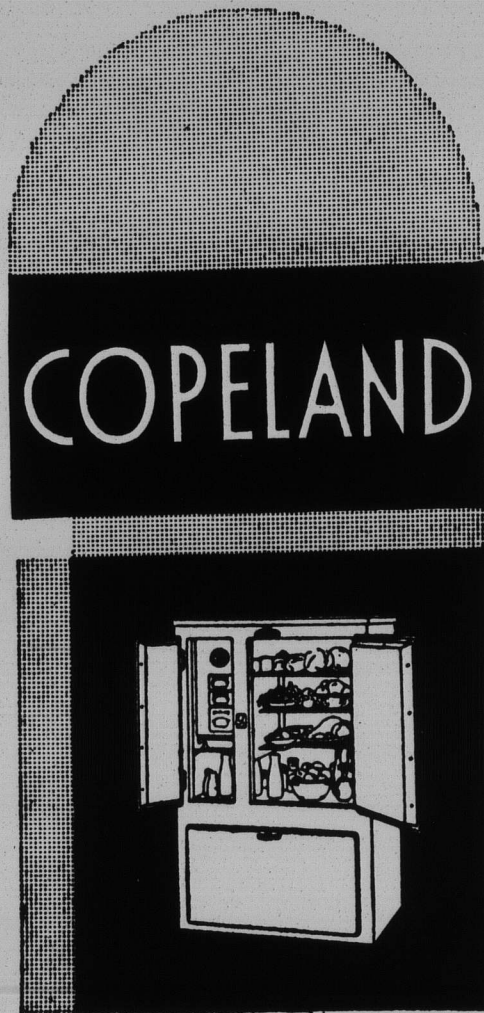
Champion log rollers from the lumber country will give daily exhibitions of their proficiency in the ancient sport of the lumber jacks. Indians in full regalia will dance their ceremonial rites in a natural setting just as they did in the days of the pioneers.

Special outdoor contests for Chicago and nearby towns will be run off during the exposition. Boys under sixteen will compete for one hundred prizes in the boys' casting tournament which will run throughout the week, while the national casting championship will be decided on Monday and Tuesday under the auspices of the National Association of Scientific Angling clubs.

The hundred odd exhibits of the exposition will be in charge of guides and oldtimers from the North Woods, Black Hills and other vacation spots, ready to regale visitors with tales of Paul Bunyan and his blue ox "Babe," the giant fish that got away and the folklore of the vacation country.

National Fraternity to Stage Huge Dance May 16
