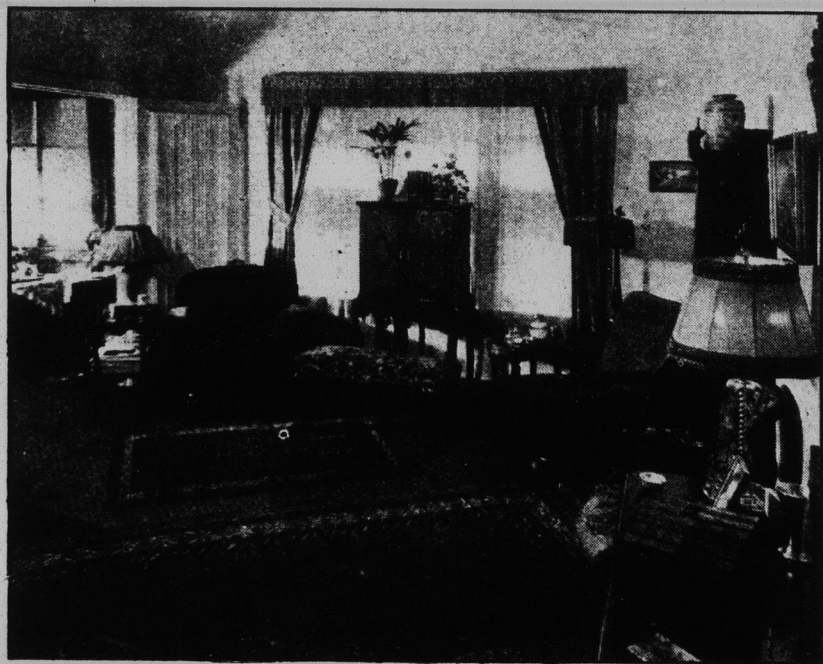
Announce Program; Charles Marshall Will Sing at Club
