ROMIG ENTERS FINALS IN ORATORICAL CLASH

Wins Semi-Finals in State Contest, Speaks for First Honors in Chicago Tonight

Alfred Romig of Glencoe won first place last Friday night in the semifinals of a state high school oratorical contest being held in Illinois under the auspices of the Chicago Daily News to pick the champion high school orator of the state, who will later represent Illinois in a nation-wide contest.

The semi-final event in which Romig spoke last Friday was held at the Proviso High school in Maywood. Five schools were entered-New Trier, Aurora, Argo, Harvey and Belvidere. Romig's closest competitor was Henry Dyer of Harvey, who won the Union League club's oratorical contest for high school students in February.

Faces Six Competitors Romig will speak at the state finals of the Chicago Daily News contest this Friday night, May 16, at Orchestra hall, Chicago. His competitors will include representatives of Proviso, Morgan Park, Geneseo, Urbana and Granite City high schools and of Lovola academy. Representatives of each of these schools won first places in sectional contests held throughout the

All orators entered in the Chicago Daily News contest must speak on some subject related to the United States constitution. "Democracy in the Constitution" is the subject of Romig's

At the state finals in Chicago this week each speaker will be required to give a four-minute extemporaneous speech in addition to his prepared oration, which it not to exceed six minutes in length. The national contest will be held at Washington, D. C., on May 24.

Won First in Sectional Romig, who has represented New Trier High school in several previous oratorical contests, received a prize of fifty dollars for winning first place in the sectional meet at Maywood last Friday. If he is successful in winning the state contest he will receive a five hundred dollar scholarship and a trip

In addition to the prize for the winner a second prize of \$250 cash schylarship and a third prize of a \$100 cash scholarship will be awarded. Men notable in the state's judicial, business and professional life will act as judges.

Prof. William Reilev of the New Trier High school history department has been coaching Romig throughout his period of participation in the Chicago Daily News elimination contests.
