

Seventh District Legionnaires Set May 28 Poppy Day

Miles E. Barry, commander of the Seventh district, American Legion, department of Illinois, has appointed Harry J. Hathaway as district Poppy chairman for Poppy day, when the legionnaires will again ask your aid in providing for the needy ex-service man.

Wednesday, May 28, has been designated this year by the national department of the Legion as Poppy day and on this, and on this day only, the public is asked to assist by buying Legion Poppies and so provide funds for carrying on the service work to which the legionnaires have pledged themselves.

In buying Legion poppies, it is explained, one is assured that the money will be used throughout the year for only service work in providing for the ex-service men who have been sick and disabled in these years following the war.

An extract from the Poppy statement the State department submitted last year showed that the posts in Cook county received nearly \$32,000, and that they expended in their communities and at

the hospitals for the year, over \$37,000, besides providing free employment service to thousands of men and aiding them to become self-supporting citizens.

The money derived by the posts in the sale of poppies in the Seventh district, and along the north shore is to be used in aiding ex-service men in the community and the veterans now being cared for at the Great Lakes and North Chicago hospitals.

LUNCHEON FOR BRIDE-TO-BE

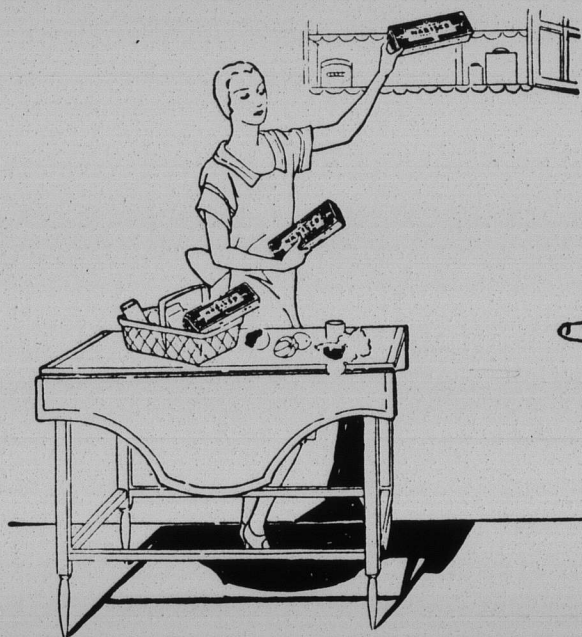
