Dr. Eisenbrand to Direct Activities of Archers' Club

Dr. George F. Eisenbrand was elected president of the North Shore Archers at a meeting of the group held last Monday evening at the Stolp school.

The organization was formed from a nucleus of archery enthusiasts who responded to the invitation sent out recently by the Wilmette Playground and Recreation board to meet and form an archery club that would be affiliated with the national organization and become a permanent organization for people interested in archery, not only open to Wilmette residents but also to the entire north shore.

Lowell Comee, national Junior Archery champion, lent his support to the project by volunteering to instruct the class free of charge, thus maintaining his amateur standing, and since the Easter holidays has been devoting his Saturday and Sunday afternoons to instructing beginners at the Recreation board range in Washington park.

The group grew large enough to effect an organization and, at the suggestion of Dudley C. Stone, recreation assistant in charge of the group, the meeting was called for last Monday evening.

Other officers elected were: Miss Julia Wild, secretary; Miss Ellen Beckwith, treasurer; Lowell Comee, captain of the green; Miss Betty Buckett, Lady Paramount, and D. C. Stone, recreation sponsor.

Dr. Eisenbrand, the president, is an archer of national reputation, having participated in many national and state meets. He has been one of the moving factors in the organization of the North Shore club.

One of the first moves the new organization made was to inaugurate Wednesday afternoon the Golden Arrow shoot. The shoot will be open to members of the organization who have never participated in a tournament. It will continue until autumn and at the end the winner will be determined by the participant who has the largest total of points to his credit.

Plans are also being made for a handicap shoot to be staged at the end of the year.

New members have the opportunity to become charter members of the organization if the membership is received before June 1. Experience is not necessary in joining the organization since Mr. Comee will be available to instruct applicants on Saturday and Sunday afternoons.
