Health Center Notes

The board of the Grosse Point Health Center held its final meeting of the season at the home of Mrs. L. M. Cozzens, 906 Elmwood avenue. The report on the activities of April showed a decrease in the work for the school children because of the vacation periods, but there was an increase in the number of cases brought to the baby clinic and to the Tuberculosis clinic at Evanston.

During the summer the baby station at the Howard school will be open as usual. With the closing of the schools for the long vacation the hours of attendance will be from 2 to 4 o'clock each Wednesday afternoon. A committee of the board has been formed to make a survey of the work of health centers and baby clinics and to draw up plans for increasing the efficiency of our own community service along those lines. Mrs. John Boylston is chairman of the committee, and will also assist at the baby clinic during June.
