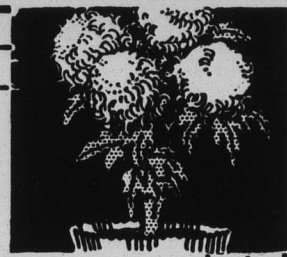
MORE RECREATION OFFICES
