

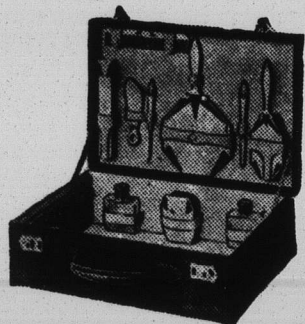
Allen Fuller Wins Tennis Title at New Trier High

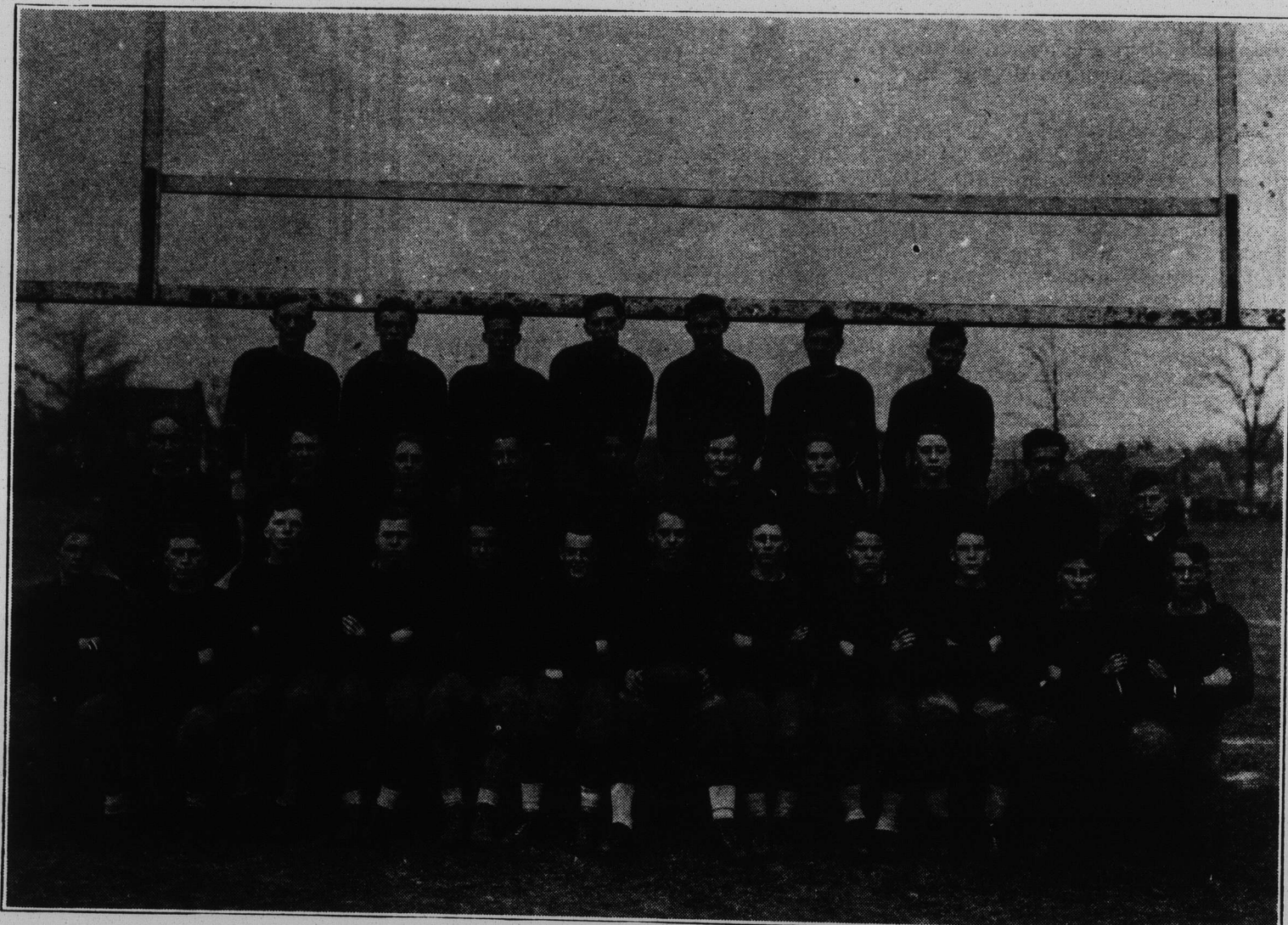
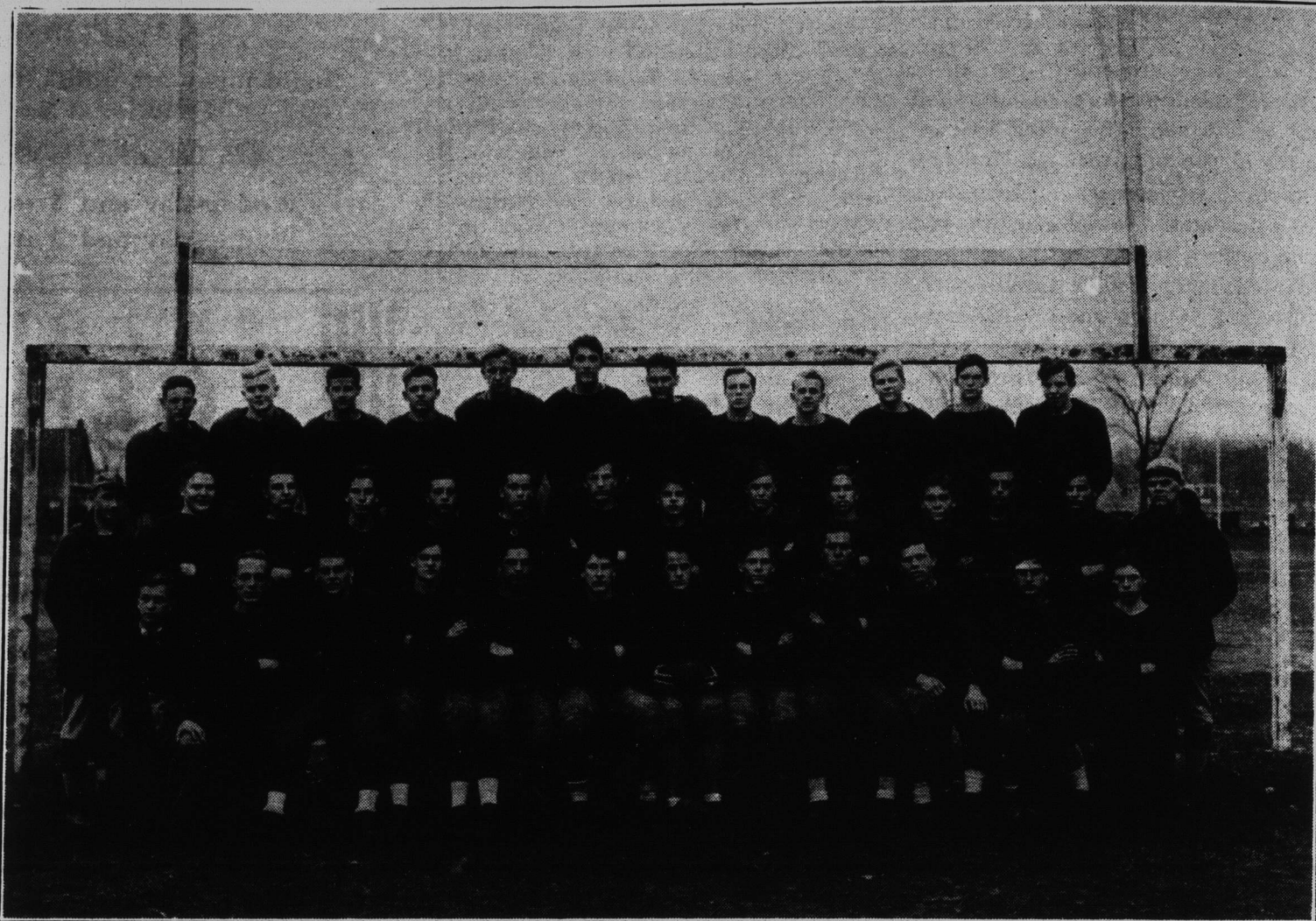
