#### Wilmette Girl Semi-Finalist in Spelling Bee


Frances Schmitz, 13, of 1634 Walnut avenue, will be one of a group of contestants tomorrow evening in the first of two semi-final events in the Cook county championship spelling-bee begin sponsored by the Chicago Daily Times and WBBM radio station. The entrants will be on the air from 8:30 to 9:30 o'clock. Frances, who is in the eighth grade at St. Joseph's school, was one of a group of 28 pupils of eight public and parochial schools who competed on January 30, in one of numerous preliminaries held in connection with the contest. She and a Chicago entrant remained after more than an hour of grueling competition.

Twenty-six pupils will engage in tomorrow's affair. Spelling will be continued until all but five are eliminated. The second of the semi-finals will be held next Saturday when five more finalists will be determined. The finals on April 4 will find ten youngsters eligible for the championship.

More than 40,000 pupils are represented in the 157 public and parochial schools originally entered in the contest. The winner receives a trip to Washington in company with a parent or guardian, all expenses paid. Others of the numerous prizes include four trips to various sections of the country and season tickets to the Civic opera.
