April Bride



Building Ordinance Copies Are Printed

One thousand copies in pamphlet form of the ordinances amending the old Wilmette building ordinance, passed on August 26, 1924, have been printed at the expense of Hoffmann Brothers Coal company. Copies of the amending ordinances may be obtained at the Village hall or at Hoffmann Brothers.

The revised building regulations modernize the old ordinance with respect to building construction of the reinforced concrete and steel type.

The revised ordinance also contains clauses intended to make buildings of frame construction more fire sais. It provides for fire stops and other protective measures against fire.

Regulations contained in the old ordinance on buildings of frame construction were more or less fragmentary, and an effort was made in revising the building ordinance to bring it up to date and to make it more in-
