

## District Fighting Mosquito Menace

In order to facilitate the flow of water in the west fork of the north branch of the Chicago river to prevent mosquito breeding, the North Shore Mosquito Abatement district has a force of men engaged in cutting brush, willows and weeds along the banks for about one and one-half miles south of Northbrook.

Waters retarded by brush, weeds and trees afford excellent breeding grounds for the culex mosquito, at this time, and it is not proposed to give these little pests any advantage, whatever, according to Supt. A. H. Meier.

Oiling of catch basins also began this week. Inspectors cover the district every week, for the purpose of oiling wherever breeding is detected.
