Mental distress, lack of nourishing foods, lack of good housing conditions, unsuitable clothing, smaller incomes, unwise health habits and extra mouths to feed set a fertile stage for tuberculosis. It is the great enemy of childhood.

Every year between Thanksgiving and Christmas the National and State Tuberculosis Associations launch a CHRISTMAS SEAL CAMPAIGN. Our Wilmette Health center is affiliated with the Chicago Tuberculosis Institute. Therefore, we will take an active part in the campaign. Our own Mrs. Albert Grinnell has been chosen Wilmette Christmas Seal chairman, and she is ably supported by the following committee: Mesdames, J. V. Smith, R. B. DeVinney, O. W. Schreiber, B. N. Cox, B. F. Lewis, Jr., and Donald Maxwell. The campaign will be carried on chiefly through the mail. The schools will do their bit also.

Each Seal costs a penny. Every penny realized by sales in Wilmette will be used for tubercular work in Wilmette. The number of cases in Wilmette is on the rapid increase. We have much local work to do. Each little seal you buy is a gallant little soldier whom you are releasing to fight in the battle for the prevention and destruction of tuberculosis. Remember, you are not spending your money to fight something unknown way over in Afghanistan, but a well-known and dreaded disease right here in Wilmette.
