

N. U. Swim Stars to Stage Meet at Shawnee Friday

Tom Robinson, Northwestern university's veteran swimming coach, will match his freshman team against his well-seasoned varsity team in the annual Frosh-Varsity swimming meet to be held at Shawnee Country club Friday evening, February 3, at 8 o'clock.

This meet is for the purpose of testing his freshmen youngsters for their ability under fire, but this year's meet promises several surprises if the "frosh" live up to the reputation they have carried over from their high school performances.

The races between Lou Diamond, freshman, and Art Highland, varsity, in the 50-yard event, and the 100-yard race between A. Corrigan, frosh, and Paul Troup, varsity, should furnish most of the excitement.

An additional feature of the meet is the water polo game to be played between the varsity team and a team composed of alumni, including Dick Howell, Harry Daniels, Ralph Breyer, Paul Corbett, and Al Schwartz, all of whom have been N. U. captains and members of the United States Olympic team.

In the last year's meet the alumni defeated the varsity team by one point but Coach Robinson expects his seasoned team to win by a few goals this Friday.
