Many Stars Will Defend Titles in "Roller" Contest

When the seventh annual roller skating meet sponsored by the Wilmette Playground and Recreation board gets under way Saturday morning, there will be a record number of last year's champions on the starting line ready to defend their titles.

The meet starts at 9 o'clock and will be held on Park avenue just west of the public library.

The reason for the large number of defending champions is that very few of last year's winners graduated into high school last spring. Among the defending champions are:

Hold Several Titles

Dorothy Davis, winner of four events in last year's meet, the one-legged race for Class C girls, the 100 yard dash for Class C girls, the 100 yard open race for girls, and co-winner with Murial Kinney of the Tandem race for Class C girls; Frank Koenen, winner of the one-legged race for Class C boys; Gerald Spinner, winner of the 100 yard dash for Class C boys, the 100 yard open race for boys, and co-winner with Eric Samuelson of the tandem race for Class C boys; Robert De Vinney, winner of the one-legged race for Class B boys, and the 75 yard dash for Class B boys.

In the Class B girls' division, Adelaide Koenen and Lucille Heerens, winners of the Class B girls' double race, will both be present for the 1933 meet. Both girls, in addition to the doubles race were place winners in other races. Lucille won the Class B girls' one-legged race and Adelaide won second place in the 75 yard dash for that event. Betty Todd, who won first place in the 75 yard dash, will also be present.

Announces Regulations

Others who are expected to participate in the meet are Virginia Todd, winner of the Class A girls' event last year, and Charles Beringer, winner of the Class A boys' event.

Dudley C. Stone, recreation assistant in charge of the meet, has announced that in case there are not sufficient entries in any particular event, members of a lower age group may enter those races but no child may enter more than four events.

The class divisions are Class A, under ten years; Class B, under twelve years; and Class C, under fourteen years. There will be a 100 yard open race for boys and another for girls.

Midget Boxers to Give Exhibition on April 1

An added feature has been announced for the Playground and Recreation board's boxing and wrestling show to be held Saturday evening, April 1, at 8:15 o'clock.

The special attraction will be a boxing bout between Donald and Sheldon Vance, 7 and 9 years old respectively, sons of Sergeant Herman Vance of the Wilmette police force.

This will not be the first appearance of the young boxers, for they have been attractions at various club entertainments. In addition to their bout, there will be another exhibition match, which will be a wrestling bout between "Swiss" Gonelli of Evanston and Kermit Simons of Wilmette, both wrestling in the 190-lb. class.
