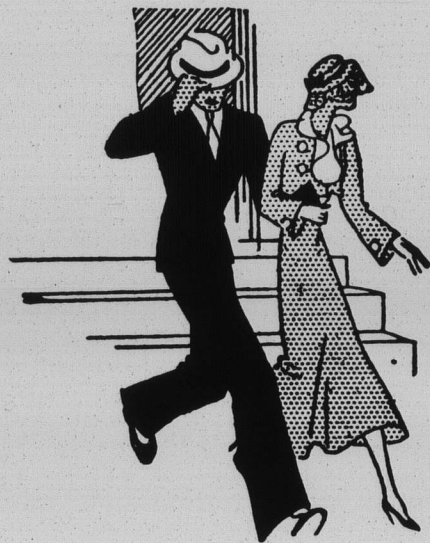

Record Final Honor Roll at Stolp School

In the minor subjects, such as music, art and science, the credit is divided by two, that is, if a pupil receives a grade of "E" in one of these subjects he is given credit for two points instead of four.
