AN ORDINANCE MAKING APPROPRIATIONS OF FUNDS FOR THE WILMETTE PARK DISTRICT, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING ON THE 1st DAY OF APRIL, 1933, AND ENDING ON THE 31st DAY OF MARCH, 1934

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Park Commissioners of The Wilmette Park District, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:
