HALLOWE'EN PARTY

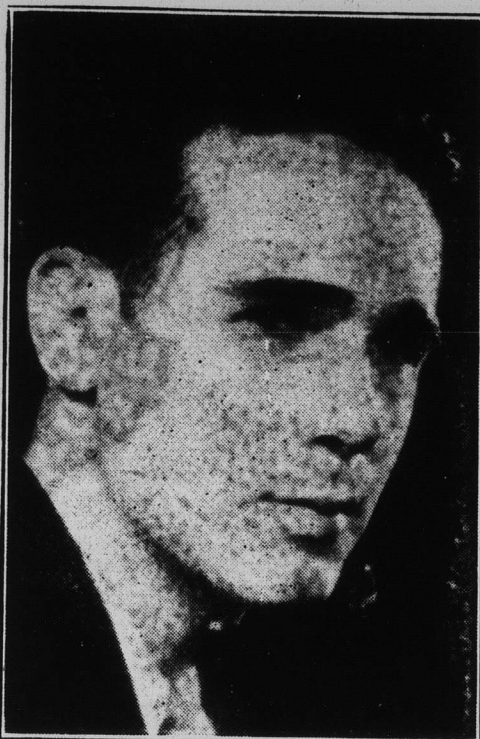
