Says Postmasters Will Remain Until Terms Are Expired

Replying to numerous inquiries regarding the status of postmasterships in the Tenth Congressional district (which includes the New Trier villages), Congressman James Simpson, Jr., has directed the following communication for publication:

"As I have received many communications from various constituents interceding in behalf of one postmaster or another throughout my district, I believe that perhaps the people of the Tenth Congressional district will be interested in knowing the situation with regard to these postmasters.

"Due to the interest indicated above, I recently made a trip to Washington, at which time I visited with Senator James Hamilton Lewis asking his attitude and policy as far as it concerned the Tenth Congressional district.

"Senator Lewis informed me that his understanding was that the administration's policy still was towards the direction of having all postmasters put under civil service, and that in the future they would be filled as the result of a civil service examination.

"Of course, this measure has not yet been passed by Congress, and although the senator did say that he intended to oppose the proposition, he did not commit himself as far as my constituents were concerned.

"I then visited the officials of the Post Office department, proper, who informed me that the civil service method was a contemplated policy and that legislation along this line would be introduced at the next session of congress, and that the present policy of the department indicated that they intended to permit all postmasters whose terms are unexpired to fill out their terms before replacing them, unless they should be removed for cause."
