

New Trier Cagers Open Season Schedule With Oak Park Friday

Inaugural Games of Suburban League Schedule Will Be Staged at Oak Park

New Trier High school's heavy-weight and lightweight basketball teams go to Oak Park Friday night of this week to meet the west side school in the opening games of the Suburban league schedule.

Oak Park's heavies lost to Riverside, 26 to 24, last Friday. Lane Tech, considered one of the strong teams of the Chicago Public High school league, also won from Oak Park by the lop-sided score of 49 to 18, earlier in the season.

Defeat Hyde Park

After losing to Senn of Chicago two weeks ago, the New Trier heavyweights came back last Saturday night to win from another Chicago team, Hyde Park, 22 to 16.

While the New Trier heavies were improving their record last Saturday, the lights slipped a notch by losing to Hyde Park, 25 to 16, after winning from Senn the previous week. The defeat by Hyde Park was not so discouraging as it might have been in view of the fact that the Chicagoans have won eight consecutive games and are picked as leading contenders for the lightweight championship of the city league. Failure of Flynn, stellar forward on the New Trier lightweight team, to connect for a single point was one of the principal reasons for Hyde Park's victory.

Wilson Scoring Ace

Wilson, playing guard, led the scoring for New Trier with a total of seven points. He sank three field goals and one free throw. Miller, substitute forward, made one field goal and three free throws for a total of five points.

Rossin, a guard, was the leading point-getter for the Hyde Park lights. He had a total of eight points on three field goals and two free throws. Goldman, center, made seven points.

After taking a 7 to 5 lead in the first quarter New Trier was held scoreless in the second quarter, and at half time Hyde Park was ahead, 9 to 7. This lead was increased to 15 to 11 at the end of the third quarter, and the final score was 25 to 16.

Nip-and-Tuck Affair

The heavyweight game was a nip-and-tuck affair all the way. New Trier jumped into an 8 to 5 lead as the first quarter ended, but the teams went off the floor at the half with the score tied, 10 to 10. At the end of the third quarter New Trier was leading, 14 to 12, and in the final period, with only a couple minutes left to play, Hyde Park tied the score. The New Trier boys were not to be denied, however, and finally emerged the victors, 22 to 16. Hyde Park kept in the running by sinking several spectacular long shots.

Three Injured in Automobile Crash

Methylene Blue Saves Monoxide Gas Victims

Early Tuesday morning Dr. R. G. Connor, 522 Greenleaf avenue, Wilmette, was attending to his medical duties at Mercy hospital, Chicago, when two automobile mechanics who had been overcome by monoxide gas were brought in. The men were Theodore Krause and Byron DeFee. Both had been worked on by an inhalator squad and neither had breathed naturally for a period of two hours and twenty minutes. Dr. Connor and an assistant, Dr. Norvert Barwasser, administered to the two men, through injection into the veins, a restorative known as methylene blue, while the inhalator squad gave artificial respiration. Both men were resuscitated and are now on the way to recovery. Methylene blue, it is said, isolates the carbon monoxide in the blood and thus permits artificially applied oxygen to perform the work of restoration.

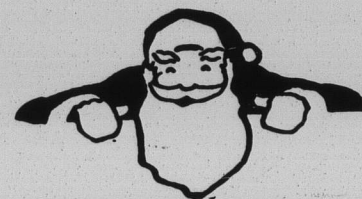
