

## CHAMP SKATERS ENTER ICE MEET

### Hope for Colder Weather to Permit Annual Wilmette Event at Green Saturday

The Wilmette Playground and Recreation board will hold its eighth annual Ice Skating meet Saturday morning, at 10 o'clock, at the Wilmette Village Green. At least that is the expressed hope of Daniel M. Davis, director of recreation. Weather conditions early this week were not auspicious for the conduct of an ice skating meet, but members of the recreation staff are ready to rush preparations to flood the pond at the first indication of lowered temperature.

Three feature races will be run during the meet, all of them for men. The Golden Skates Derby, a one mile open race, will be the main attraction of the afternoon and draws the largest number of entries of any of the feature group. However, the two mile open race always draws its share of entrants, according to Mr. Davis, and, although conflicting with one of the big Chicago meets, which will be held in the afternoon of the same day, the two-mile race has already received a large number of registrations.

#### Limited to Villagers

The half mile race for men, the third of the feature races, is limited to Wilmette residents 15 years of age and over. As in each of the other races, a pair of skates will be awarded to the winner of the race and silver and bronze medals to the second and third place winners.

Since the one and two mile races were opened to the general public in 1930, they have attracted some of the renowned skaters of the country, among them Frank Stack, Canadian National champion in 1930 and Olympic skater for Canada in 1932, Victor Ronchetti and Julius Hoeft of Chicago, Ed Rudolph of Glencoe and others who placed in the events. Other well known skaters were entered but did not place in the races.

#### Handicap Girls' Race

The open race for girls 16 years of age and over has been changed this year and will be run as a handicap

race for Wilmette girls only. Those girls who have won the race in previous years will be handicapped by starting a given distance back of the other competitors.

Events other than the feature races will be:

220 yard dash for girls under 12 years of age, 220 yard dash for boys under 12 years of age, 220 yard dash for girls 12 and 13 years of age, 220 yard dash for boys 12 years of age, 220 yard dash for boys 13 years of age, 440 yard dash for girls 14 and 15 years of age, 440 yard dash for boys 14 and 15 years of age, and an unknown distance race for boys 12 and 13 years of age who have not placed in previous races during the day.

Registration may be made at the Shelter house at the Village Green ice pond, with any of the Wilmette public school physical training instructors, or by calling the recreation office, 914 Central avenue. Telephone 468.
