### Cut Cost of Shipping Car to Vacation Spot

A marked reduction in the cost of taking one's automobile along for enjoyment during a vacation trip will be made January 15 by the Chicago and North Western railway, it is announced by R. Thomson, passenger traffic manager of the road, Chicago. In many cases the reduction will be as much as 50 percent.

Contrasted against the old arrangement which required four oneway or round-trip tickets for the transportation of two people and an automobile, the new arrangement will allow two people traveling on first-class one-way or round-trip tickets to have the automobile sent along in expedited freight service by purchasing one one-way ticket at the 3.6 cents a mile rate, \$79.84, for instance, from Chicago to California for the car. Last year two one-way travelers to California had to pay \$149.68 extra to take along the automobile.

The new rates are in effect between all points on the Chicago and North Western railway and between those points and connecting line points east, west and south.
