## Record Results Made by Girls in Distance Throws

Results of the winter basketball distance throw tests given as the second series of the 1933-34 school year athletic tests by the physical training department of the Wilmette public schools are announced this week by Daniel M. Davis, director of recreation.

One new record was established in this series of tests which was limited to girls in the sixth, seventh, and eighth grades. The tests are given in the various groups classifications according to age, weight, and height, and each group has a different set of standards by which to measure its performances. The new record was made in the Class A group by Helen Clarke of Stolp school, who bettered Jane Solomon's record for that class of 56 feet, made last year.

Since the tests have been given inside for the past two years only records made during that time are accepted by the physical training department. The record for the entire school, of all girls taking the test, is held by Dorothy Davis, formerly of Howard school, who made a record throw of 67 feet last year which was unequaled in this year's tests.

## Attention, Please, Boxers, Wrestlers!
