

Katherine Hamilton, Pauline Manchester, in Feb. 27 Recital

A hundred and twenty-four patrons and patronesses are signifying their interest in the approaching joint recital of two Winnetka artists, Katherine Hamilton, violinist, and Pauline Manchester, pianist, who are to give a recital in Kimball hall, Chicago, Tuesday evening, February 27, under the auspices of The Musical Guild.

Work Outstanding

Each year the guild selects one or two talented members, which it sponsors in a loop recital. The work of both Miss Hamilton and Miss Manchester has been so outstanding that the guild was eager this year to give its wide circle of friends the opportunity of hearing the two young artists, not only because of the excellence of their technique, but also because of the unusual program material they offered. Both have studied with masters in Europe—Miss Hamilton under Jacques Thibaud and Marcel Chailley in Paris, and Miss Manchester under Artur Schnabel in Berlin. Incidentally, this is the first time the general public will hear the artists since their European studies.

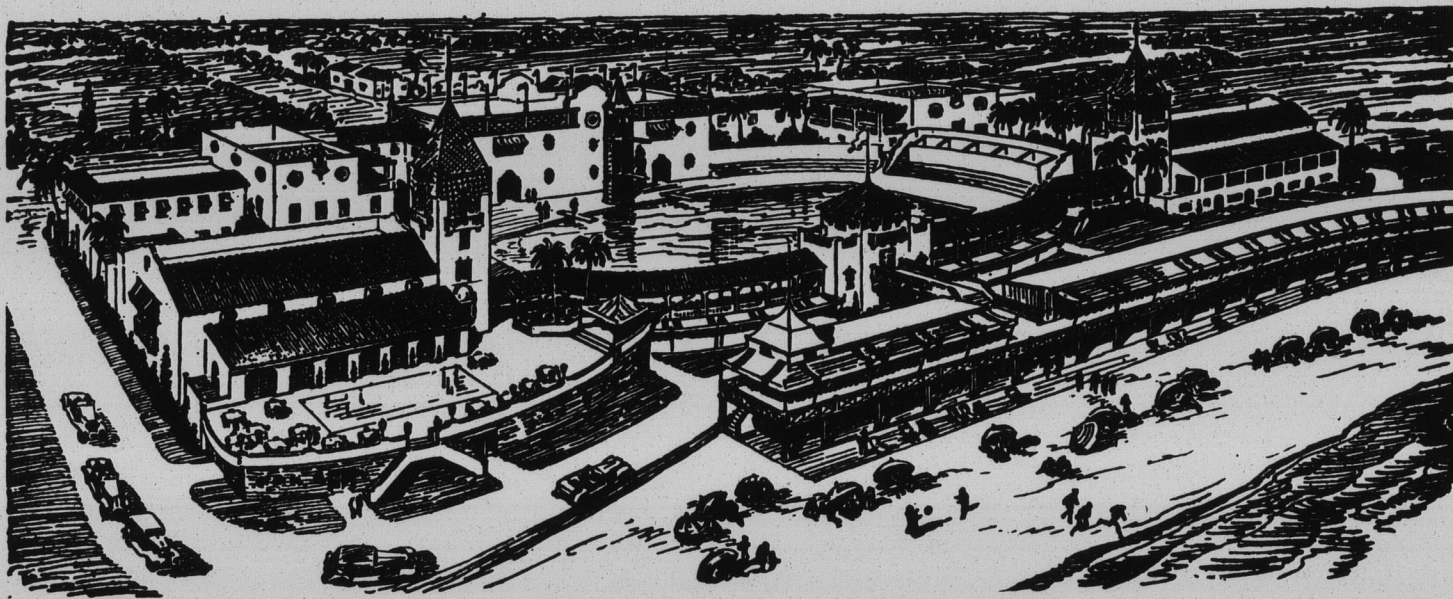
