NEW TRIER SCHOLARSHIP IMPROVES

Statistical Survey at High School Indicates Record for Semester Above Normal

The scholarship of New Trier High school as a whole was very low. school students during the first semester of the current year was decidedly better than the previously established normal for the school, the results of a statistical survey recently completed by the department of reference and research show.

In making the survey the number of grades given out and the percentage of the total number of students receiving each grade was taken into consideration. The all-school average for the first semester was 2.26, whereas the normal school average is 2.00. The precentage of failure for the scholarship summary by classes:

The freshman boys' scholarship average was better than the senior boys' average for the first time on record, the comparative figures being 2.36 for the fershmen and 2.30 for the seniors. This was true despite the fact that the senior boys' average was higher this year than any other first semester senior boys' average on record at New Trier. The freshman girls and junior girls made records decidedly better than their previous normal averages.


