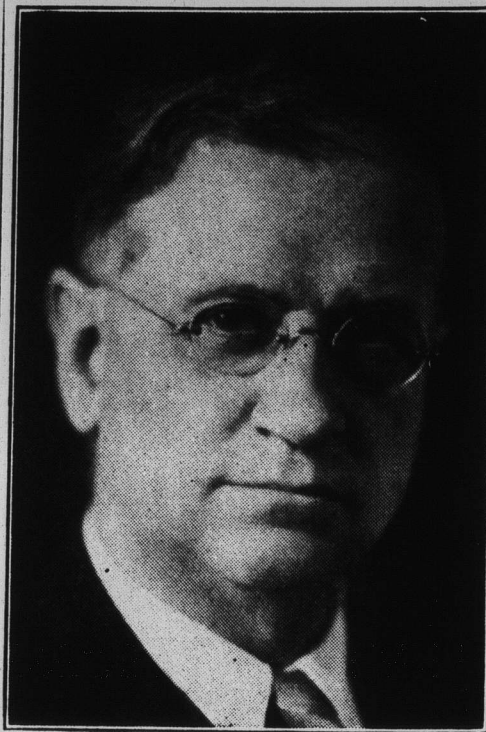
### TAKE OVERNIGHT HIKE
