

New Trier Cagers Open League Season Against Waukegan Five

Clash in Leslie F. Gates Gym
This Friday

A doubleheader with Waukegan will open New Trier High school's Suburban league basketball season Friday night of this week at the Leslie F. Gates gymnasium, Winnetka.

Waukegan, a new member of the league, is an old rival of New Trier, and usually turns out winning teams on the basketball court as well as on the gridiron. Last Saturday night the Waukegan heavies lost to Lindblom, of Chicago, 27 to 25, and the lightweights beat Lindblom, 24 to 23.

Win From Hyde Park

New Trier's teams finished their second week of competition Saturday night by winning a doubleheader from Hyde Park of Chicago. After trailing until the fourth quarter, the New Trier heavies began finding the basket with more regularity and nosed out their opponents, 27 to 25. The lightweights whipped Hyde Park easily, 35 to 25.

Fitzgerald, who was substituting at center, led the fourth quarter attack that beat the Hyde Park heavies. He sank two field goals and a free throw in this period. Meanwhile his teammates were doing their stuff, too. Wilson, guard, made a field goal and a free throw. Mee, forward, and Anderson, guard, each scored one goal from the field.

Hyde Park led 6 to 5 at the quarter, 12 to 8 at the half and 20 to 15 at the end of the third quarter, but this didn't discourage the New Trier players, as the final score indicates.

All Share Scoring

Every member of the New Trier team broke into the scoring, which points to the fact that Suburban league opponents will have to regard every New Trier player as a definite scoring threat.

Against Hyde Park the two New Trier guards, Anderson and Wilson, each made six points. Mee, forward, and Fitzgerald, substitute center, got five each. Fisher, center, made four and Ball, forward, one.

The same kind of scoring ability was shown by the heavyweights in the game with the alumni Wednesday night of last week, which the alumni lost, 32 to 27. The two New Trier forwards, Mee and Ball, got six points apiece, Fisher, center, and Wilson, guard, counted seven points each. Anderson, guard, made four points, and Fitzgerald, who substituted at forward, made two.

Trounce Alumni

The heavies had no great difficulty in disposing of the alumni. They led 9 to 4 at the end of the first quarter, 17 to 8 at the half and 21 to 17 at the end of the third quarter.

"Duke" Scott, playing center for the alumni, was the high point man of the game. He sunk five field goals and three free throws for a total of thirteen points. Bob Hallquist, forward, and Clarence Dahl, guard, made six points apiece for the alumni.

The New Trier lightweights suffered their first defeat of the season Wednesday night of last week when a team of alumni lightweights whipped them, 26 to 22. A more accurate account of the game might be that Richard Flynn did the whipping. Playing forward for the alumni, he dropped in seven field goals and two free throws for a total of sixteen points.

In the first half the school team made not a single field goal, scoring
