Extend Campaign to Swell Knights of Columbus Ranks

Ouilmette council, Knights of Columbus, is fast nearing its quota of new members in the order's Mobilization for Catholic Action campaign which began March 17. Chairman William Connor, 1815 Walnut avenue, announced early this week that approximately thirty applications have been received by his committee, which has charge of interviewing more than two hundred Catholic men in this vicinity.

The finish of the drive was originally scheduled for Sunday, March 31. However, Mr. Connor received word last Saturday that the movement had been extended one week, or until midnight of Sunday, April 7. This announcement proved welcome to the local organization as it had not been able to complete its work in the original specified time.

Extend Campaign

The Supreme board of directors explained the reasons for the time extension in a letter to Mr. Connor. A portion of the letter follows:

"Reports from all parts of North America are splendid. Our present membership has been aroused to greater activity for church and country, and new members have been coming in at the unprecedented rate of 1,500 a day, for a grand total in two weeks of campaigning of 20,000. I say unprecedented advisedly, as I believe no fraternal organization has ever experienced such a wholesale enlistment of new strength.

"This being the case, it would be a
great mistake to terminate this great
effort on March 31 simply because we
had set an arbitrary closing date. Not
only would it be a mistake, but it would
be an injustice both to those councils
that are now working at full speed and
to those that have been delayed or handicapped for reasons over which they to those that have been delayed or nan-dicapped for reasons over which they have had no control. On the Pacific coast, for example, our whole organiza-tion program, because of distances in-volved, was one week late in starting, and reports from that quarter are just beginning to come in. In some of the middle western places, the work has middle western places, the work has been handicapped by sandstorms and by recent renewed floods in the Mississippi valley; and certain sections of Canada, and of our own northwest, are still under ice and snow, making communications and inter-community team-work most difficult.

"For these reasons, the Supreme Board of Directors has decided to add another week to the intensive campaign period. We have set out to enlist 50,000 new members, and on the basis of reports now in hand I believe we are going to get them."
