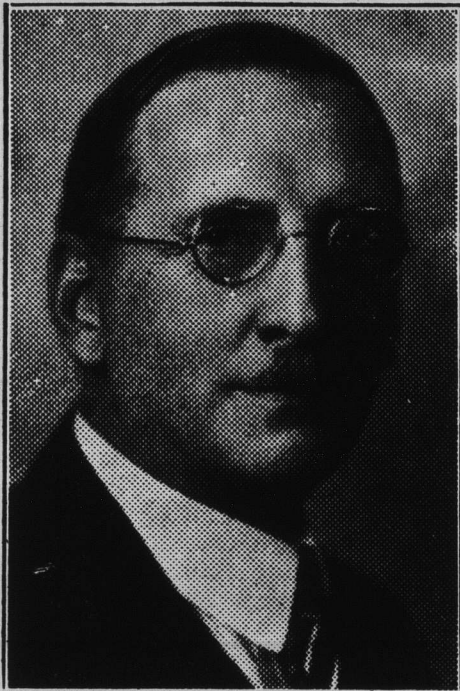


LOGAN-HOWARD P. T. A.

Dr. H. W. Gentles, director of First Aid and Life Saving for the Chicago chapter, American Red Cross, will speak before the P. T. A. meeting at the Howard school in Wilmette on April 9, at 2:45 o'clock.

Born in Scotland, Dr. Gentles was graduated from Glasgow University Medical school and trained the St. Andrews Ambulance association. Aft-

er his arrival in the United States in 1892, Gentles trained the Chicago police in First Aid and acted as superintendent of ambulance service at the World's Columbian exposition.

His first assignment with the American Red Cross came in 1911, before the formation of the Chicago chapter, when he was appointed first aid representative in Chicago for the National Red Cross. He assumed charge of the first aid and life saving activities of the organization immediately upon the formation of the Chicago chapter in June, 1915.

Dr. Gentles is a member of the board of directors of the Chicago Safety council and surgeon of the Chicago council, Boy Scouts of America. He founded the Uniformed Red Cross First Aid corps, a group of ninety-one qualified instructors who are volunteering their services to groups within the jurisdiction of the the Chicago chapter.

The Cook County Highway police are at the present time receiving the Red Cross First Aid course under the supervision of Dr. Gentles. The Police department of Evanston has been trained and the departments in Lake Forest and Chicago Heights are now under instruction.

Dr. Gentles will give an informal talk on the subject of "Accidents in the Street and in the Home."

"The Adolescent and Religion" will be the topic for discussion by the Adolescent Study group Tuesday, April 9, at 10 o'clock at the Howard auditorium. Miss Ruth Elmer will be the speaker.

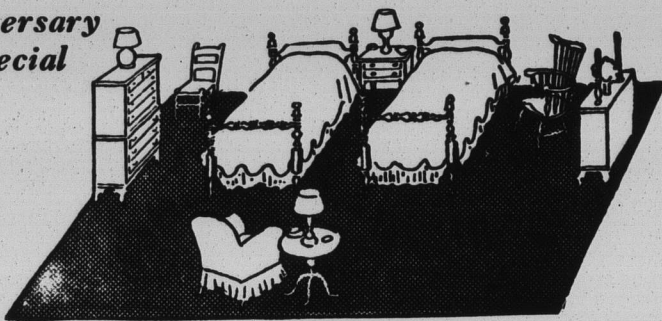
