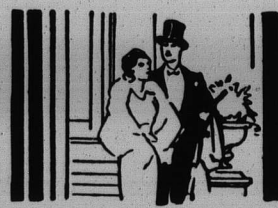

Edgewater Beach Starts College Amateur Nights

In a sincere quest for youthful talent, the Edgewater Beach hotel, in cooperation with the Columbia Broadcasting system, has started an Amateur contest for college and high school students that will be held each Wednesday night and known as "Collegiate Amateur Nights."

Numerous students from Northwestern, Chicago, Loyola, De Paul, and Lake Forest, as well as high schools all over the north shore have already entered the contest.

With Truman Bradley, famous announcer, acting as master of ceremonies, the contest will be held each Wednesday for at least the next four weeks in the Marine dining room. Auditions to select talent eligible to compete will be held each Monday from 4 to 6 o'clock in one of the hotel's ballrooms under the supervision of Johnny Hamp whose celebrated orchestra is now playing in the dining room.

All types of talent are being sought, the monthly winner to receive a week's engagement at an attractive salary to entertain with whatever orchestra is playing at the hotel. Ten aspirants are to be selected from each Monday afternoon's mass audition, and popular applause on the following Wednesday night will determine two talented possibilities who must then compete with the subsequent weekly winners at the end of the month for the reward.

Some of the contests will be broadcast over station WBBM and if the event proves as popular as indications point, it is planned to hold a "Grand Finale All Star Contest" among monthly winners in March or April. A girl and young man will be selected each month. The outstanding discoveries will be promoted for a commercial career by CBS Artists' bureau. The contest is limited to college or high school students.
